





TODAY'S LIGHT: May 4-10, Joshua 4--15

- Joshua 8:34 records that Joshua read all the words of the law—the blessings and the curses just as they are written
 in the Book of the Law. All of God's Word points us to Jesus, our Savior. Relate the saving work of Jesus to the
 blessings and curses written in the Book of the Law. See 2 Corinthians 5:21 and Galatians 4:4.
- 2. In Joshua 13–15, we read about Joshua and his friend Caleb, now elderly gentlemen (Joshua was between ninety and one hundred years old, and Caleb was eighty-five). These chapters remind us that God still had work for both to do (see especially Joshua 13:1 and 14:10–12). Reflect on Caleb's words (14:10–12) as you think about God. How is or how might He be at work in your life during your advanced years?
